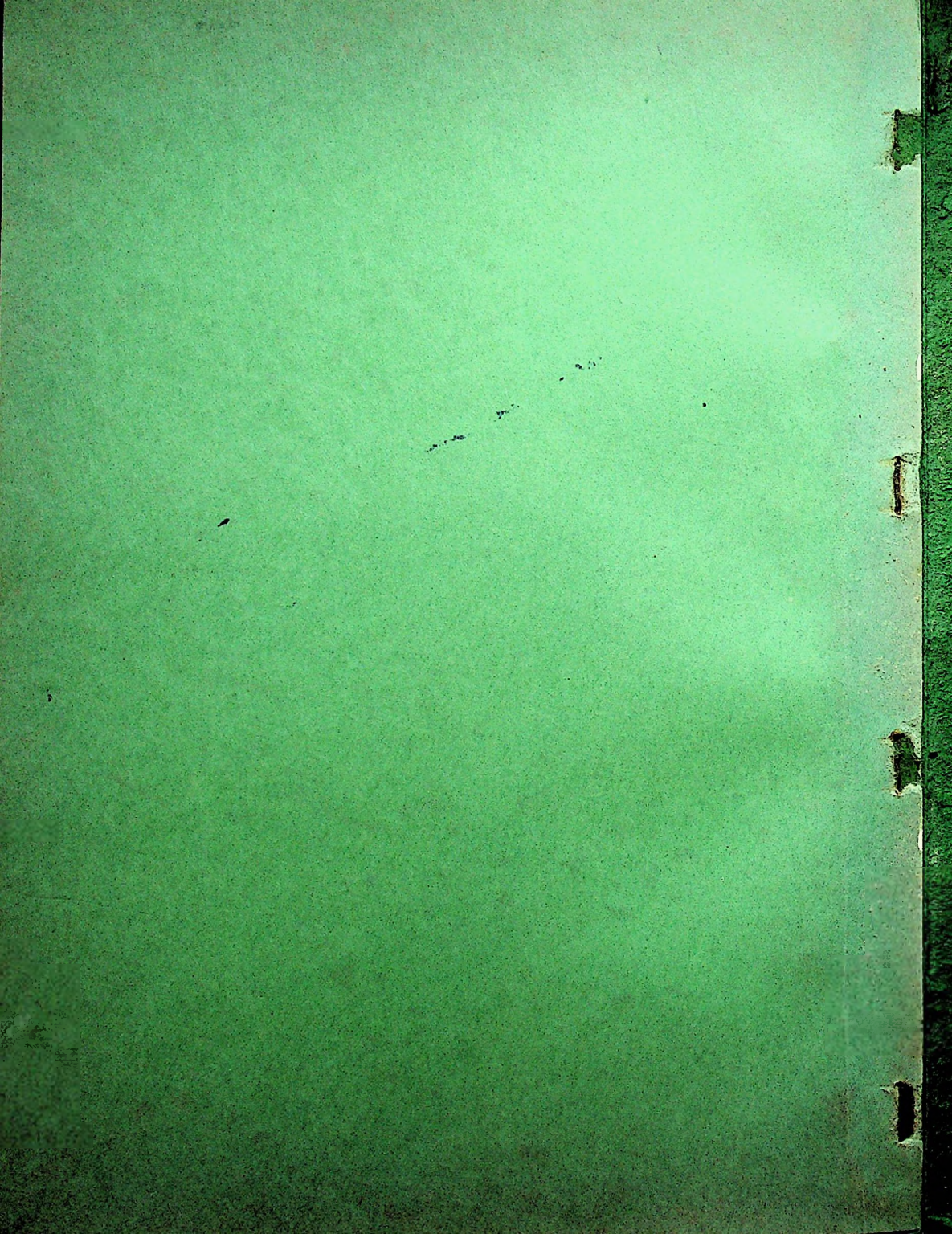

GALION'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS

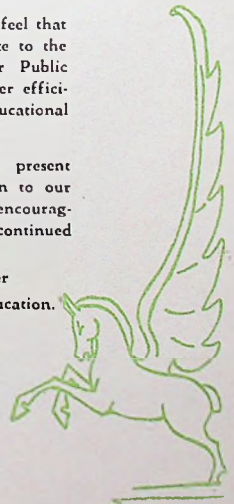

Mr. Bemiller is quiet and patient, having a dignity, which, marking him as a man of ability, commands the respect of all who are drawn into the range of his magnetic personality.

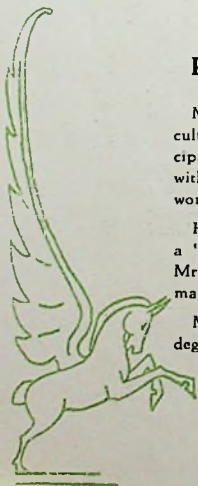


PRINCIPAL W. L. SWICK

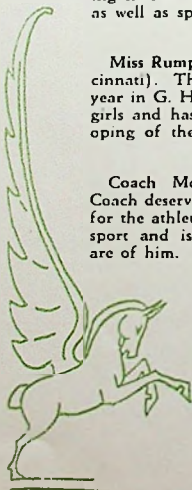

AU REVOIR

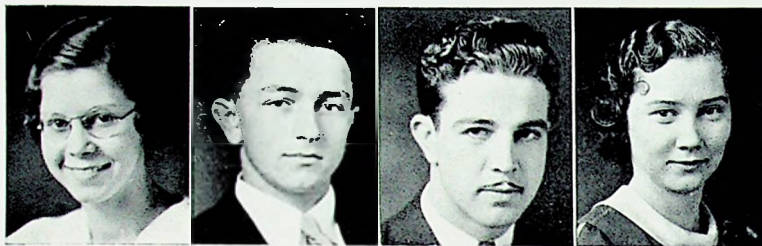
The Class of 1934, graduating this year, looks back upon its four years in High School and is able to count a distinct gain.
